Education is a basic human right



Congratulations to our secondary-school graduates!

Four of our children from Noble House - Nabin and Laxman (pictured), Sita, Binita - and Outreach Program student Anisha completed their Secondary Education Examinations (SEE, year 10 equivalent) this year, marking the end of their secondary school journey. We congratulate the students on their hard work and are delighted to advise that all five passed the SEE with good marks!

Each child intends to embark on 'Plus 2', which is year 11/12, undertaken at vocational and technical colleges to prepare students for tertiary studies. The admissions process is almost complete, and the children are due to commence their studies shortly. This new chapter will mean moving out of Noble House and into shared accommodation closer to their chosen colleges - but still under the care of Meg's.



Binita and Sita are planning to study Plus 2 in management/education, and Laxman, Nabin and Anisha will all study a science based Plus 2 program, setting them up for further studies in fields such as engineering and IT. Through our Higher Education Budget Meg's Children will support each of the children by covering tuition fees, stationery and books, uniforms and a living allowance.

Visit to Nepal and a new MoU with the Siddhi Memorial Foundation

In January committee members Trish, Kate W, Marie-Lou and Ali travelled to Nepal to catch up with the children and sign a new five-year Memorandum of Understanding with our partner organisation Siddhi Memorial Foundation. Our working relationship with Siddhi is critical to the success of our efforts in Nepal. The COVID pandemic had prevented the committee from travelling to Nepal for almost three years, so there was a lot of catching up to do!

Both are working full time jobs that cover their living expenses and are planning to stay in Jhapa, where they will embark on tertiary study in hotel management (Malina) and business accountancy (Bibesh), which will be funded through the Meg's Children payback scholarship program.
